November is here and although we soon get an extra hour of sleep, the weather is turning cooler. We do encourage students to dress warmly as they are expected to be outside at recess and lunch.

Mrs. Skipper, our Success Coach, is busy visiting our classrooms talking to the students about Zones of Regulation which parallels our resiliency program. Students are taught to recognize what triggers cause them to get upset and what strategies they can put into place to help calm themselves and problem solve. Teachers are also introducing different activities in the classroom that relate to our Resiliency themes. This month’s theme is “Tearing Off the Labels.” This theme identifies how easy it is for our students to get a reputation because of choices made. These labels may not be very nice and we soon learn how difficult it is to have others think of us differently. We will continue to work with students on these skills as they practice their problem solving skills and recognition of the part they play in different situations. Part of resiliency is also the idea that our students are capable of being prepared for class and any other activities that may arise during the week. Please remind your child or children to check class notes or the agendas for special activities that may be happening. It will be necessary for them to feel prepared for the week.

Building independence and self-reliance are necessary as you get older. Thank you to the parents who are supporting this program.

It is so wonderful to see all of the parents around the school helping with a number of different activities. Thank you to all of the parents who took on a position with our School Council. PROTECTING YOUR KIDS ONLINE

TAKE CHARGE

Set some ground rules.

Establish basic guidelines like when your kids can go online, what sites they can visit, and how many texts they can send a month, so everyone is on the same page.

Research before you buy.

Did you know that handheld games can connect to the Internet or that many laptops have built-in webcams? Understand what technology you're bringing into your home.

Don't just sit there— REPORT!

If your kids are dealing with cyberbullies or potential predators, report them to the website, cell phone service, law enforcement, or www.cybertipline.com.

MONITOR

Supervise Internet use.

If you can see what your kids are doing, they're less likely to get in trouble.

Safeguards ≠ Safe Kids.

Installing CIA-level monitoring software on your kids' computers does not guarantee they'll be safe online. Technology can't replace your time and attention as a parent or guardian.

Don't go overboard.

It's smart to keep an eye on your kids' social networking profiles, but it's never cool when you post embarrassing messages or pictures to their page.

COMMUNICATE

Talk to your kids; they're not as mysterious as you think.

Your kids might not tell you everything, but that doesn't mean you shouldn't ask. Get involved so you're not the last to know.

Challenge them to a duel.

If you have kids who like to play video or computer games, ask if you can play, too. When you respect their interests, they're more likely to respect your rules.

Don't pull the plug.

Taking away your kids' Internet access because they've done something wrong doesn't solve the problem. Talk to them about protecting themselves and respecting others online.
